- ✓ Confirm you meet our **Academic Requirements**
 - Completion of College Academic Distribution Requirements (CADRs)
 - Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0
- ✓ Prepare your **Personal Essay, Writing Supplement, and Activities Statement**
- ✓ Fill out and submit your **Application**
- ✓ Check your **Application Portal** for updates on your application status

IMPORTANT DEADLINES

Early Action Deadline: **November 15**

Regular Decision Deadline: **January 15**

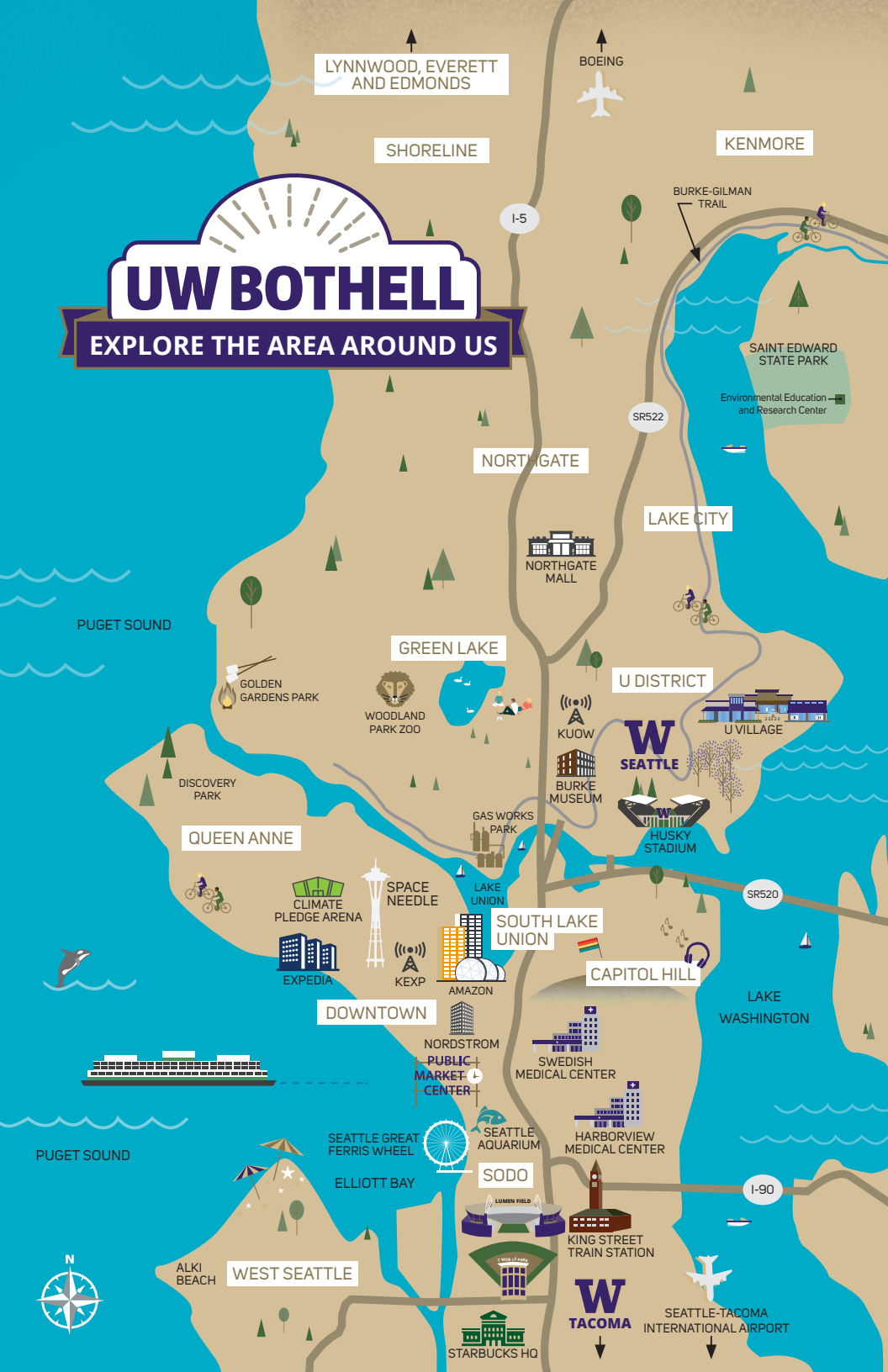
