Fulbright Program

What is it?

Goal

- The U.S. Government's flagship educational and cultural exchange program
- Approximately 8,000 grants awarded each year
- Opportunities for students, professionals, artists and scholars to study, research, and teach in 155+ countries around the world


To increase mutual understanding between people of the U.S. and people of other countries through exchange

Senator J. William Fulbright ARKANSAS

- 1946: Created by U.S. Congress
- Student Program administered in U.S. by IIE
- Administered overseas by NGOs and U.S. embassies

Types of Grants

For US citizens

- Fulbright U.S. Student Program
- Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program
- Fulbright U.S. Scholar Specialist Program
- Fulbright NEXUS Program
- Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange Program
- Distinguished Fulbright Awards in Teaching
- Fulbright Public Policy Fellowship Program
- Fulbright-Hays Exchange Programs

Selection factors

- Strong academic and/or professional preparation
- Demonstrated leadership ability
- Less than 6 months spent in host country previously (excluding undergrad study abroad)
- Community involvement

Eligibility









- U.S. citizen by application deadline
- At least bachelor's degree for **US Student Program**
- PhD or equivalent experience for US Scholar Program
- Proficiency in language of host country (varies by country)





Grant Benefits

- Round-trip airfare
- Stipend *
- Accident & Sickness Insurance
- Other <u>possible</u> benefits *
 - Support for dependents
 - Research allowance
 - Tuition
 - > Language lessons
 - Enhancement activities
 - Disability-related accommodations

* Varies, dependent on grant and host country







U.S. Student Program

Two Types of Grants

Study/Research

- 950+ awards
- 8-10 months
- 140 countries
- Independent study/research projects in academic & arts fields

English Teaching Assistantship (ETA)

- 1,200+ awards
- 8-10 months
- ~75 countries
- Help teach English and U.S. culture in the classroom





Special Award Opportunities

Fulbright National Geographic Digital Storytelling Fellowship

U.S. State Department National Geographic Complementary Missions:

- Fulbright "increases mutual understanding"
- National Geographic "inspires people to care about the planet"

Fulbright-National Geographic Digital Storytelling Fellows will:

- Examine relevant issues abroad
- Report stories digitally (content featured online in NatGeo blog)
- Open minds to new perspectives
- Inspire others to engage in the conversation
- Receive training, support, and mentorship by National Geographic Editors

4-5 grants annually; experience in techniques essential

Application Process: Students

Fulbright U.S. Student Program

- Begin searching by world region or country
- Currently enrolled students must apply through UW:
- •UW deadline: Sept. 6
- Campus interview required: Sat, Sept 23
- National deadline: Oct. 6

Alumni who are not currently enrolled are not required, but are strongly encouraged, to apply through UW.

U.S. Scholar Program

Main Types of Grants

Core

- 800+ awards
- Research or teaching
- 3-9 months
- Flex Option allows multiple visits to host country

View 2017-2018 Catalog of Awards Total Awards* Africa, Sub-Saharan East Asia / Pacific Europe Middle East / N. Africa South, Central Asia Western Hemisphere * Many awards produce more than 1 grant, 500 award listings will yield approximately 800 grants.

Specialist

- 3-12 weeks
- Research, teaching or special projects
- Must first apply to be on roster, then placements are made

International Education Administrators Seminars

2-week networking trips to France, Germany, India, Japan or Korea

- •Search catalog by discipline, region, qualifications, program type, or keyword https://awards.cies.org/
- Apply by August 1 for most grants

- •Search catalog by discipline, region, qualifications, program type, or keyword
- Rolling deadline

Application Components

Completely Online Process

- 1. Basic Personal Data
- 2. Essays
 - Statement of Purpose / Grant Proposal
 - Personal Statement / CV
- 3. Reports / References
 - Foreign Language Evaluation
 - Three (3) References
- 4. Transcripts
- 5. Other
 - Affiliation Letter(s): Research/Study only
 - Arts: Supplementary Materials
 - Special Opportunities have additional requirements

Research / Study Grants



General Qualifications

- Well-developed project and/or study plan
- High level of academic and/or professional achievement
- Demonstrated leadership ability
- Sufficient language proficiency (varies by country)
- Community engagement-service orientation





English Teaching Assistantship









Improve students' understanding of **English language & U.S. culture**

- Assistant teach 20-30 hours/week
- Excellent communication skills
- Flexibility, adaptability, openness
- Demonstrated leadership & service
- Host language proficiency varies by country









Statement of Grant Purpose

For Research/ Study Grant:

- 2 pages, single-spaced (Students)
- 3-5 pages (Scholars)
- Answer: what, where, how, when, who, why
- Demonstrate knowledge of the field
- Demonstrate awareness of your needs in the host country
- Directly address any potential concern about project feasibility or your ability
- Free time community engagement idea(s)











Statement of Grant Purpose

For ETA Grant:

- 1 page, single-spaced (Students only)
- Explain how you will reach your goals as an ETA, and why you would like to be an ETA in that country
- Describe a small, supplemental research or community engagement project (not location specific)
- Demonstrate, through your experiences, your sincere desire to teach English to non-native speakers











Personal Statement

- 1 page, single-spaced
- Context for your application
- Your academic, professional, other key experiences that have prepared you
- Expand on critical elements of your resume
- Where this research/teaching will lead you in the future
- Personal, but not too personal











Letters of Affiliation



- Signed letter, on letterhead
- Host country contact who will advise and/or mentor you
- Professional at a university, laboratory, library, community org, etc.
- Requirements vary by country

Letters of Recommendation



- Submitted electronically, but should still be signed & on letterhead
- ETA recommenders answer specific questions rather than write a traditional letter
- Read the online instructions for both the applicant and the recommender
- Be strategic about who you ask
- Make sure they can meet our campus deadline
- Provide information and details about yourself, your project/plan, the country, the Fulbright program, etc.




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National Screening Committee (NSC) Review Guidelines 2017-2018

Review Categories and Elements for Study/Research in Academic Fields



Tips from a National Selection Committee Member

- 1. Committee composition
 - Faculty from diverse colleges/universities big, small, public, private
 - Deep knowledge of region/country (except Arts committees field specific)
 - Write with authority to a well-informed audience of skeptics
- 2. Don't come across as naïve
 - Do your homework feasibility, best location, contingencies
 - Demonstrate that you are smart, capable, an ambassador
- 3. Affiliation letters are critical
 - Should show substantial communication with you, not just pro forma
 - Should demonstrate that the host understands your project
- 4. Language skills and/or significant cultural competency
 - Previous cross-cultural or language experience
 - That you're interested in connecting with host community in a meaningful way
