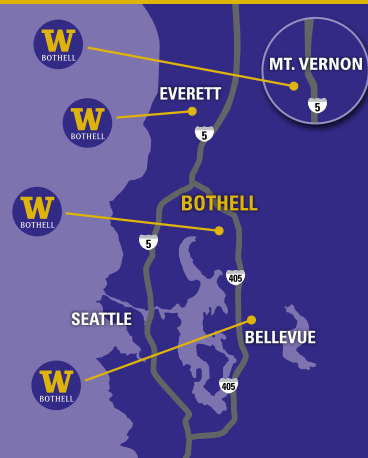




FAST FACTS 2010-11

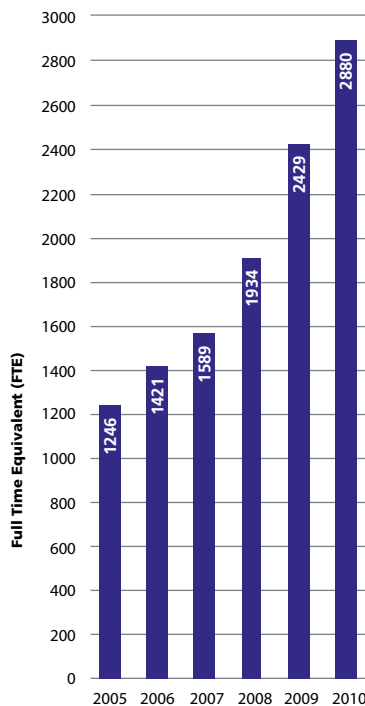

Did You Know?

- UW Bothell has awarded 9,000 degrees and 660 certificates.
- 72% of students are enrolled full-time and 28% are enrolled part-time.
- 57% of current students receive financial aid.
- UW Bothell's economic impact to Washington state is \$191 million and to the city of Bothell \$103 million.
- 71 students are in off-campus student housing.
- UW Bothell is one of the most ethnically diverse public university's at 36%.
- UW Bothell has awarded scholarships totaling \$351,000 to 132 recipients.
- UW Bothell offered \$18.8 million in aid funds to 1,611 students during the 2009-10 academic year.
- UW Bothell has an endowment of \$2,640,521 as of July 1, 2010.
