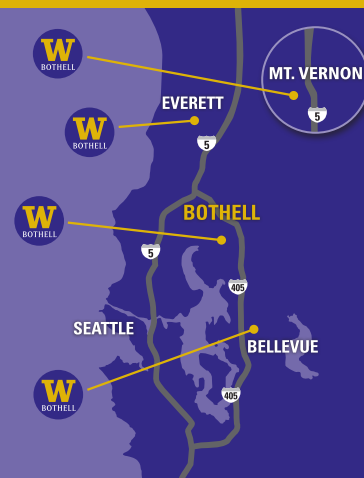




FAST FACTS 2011-12

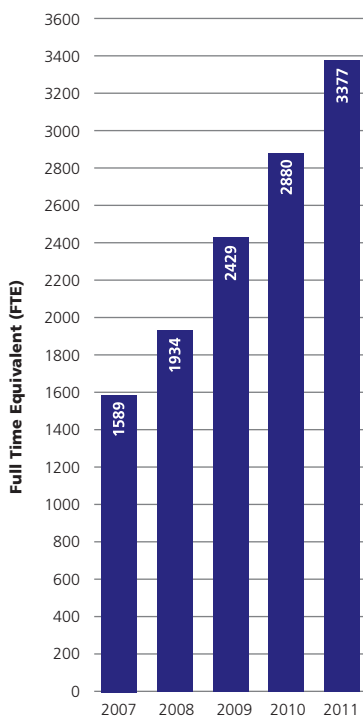

Did You Know?

- UW Bothell has awarded over 10,500 degrees.
- UW Bothell's economic impact to the state of Washington is \$191 million and to the city of Bothell \$103 million.
- UW Bothell is the largest branch campus in the state.
- 224 students are in student housing.
- UW Bothell is one of the most ethnically diverse public universities in Washington.
- Freshman applications increased by 20% from 2010 while transfer applications grew by 24%.
- Freshman are 57% first-generation, 56% students of color and 25% historically underrepresented.
- 59% of all students received grants, scholarships, loans or work study awards.
- UW Bothell has awarded scholarships totaling \$639,000 to 250 recipients.
- UW Bothell offered \$37.1 million in aid funds to 2,700 students during the 2010-11 academic year.
- UW Bothell has an endowment of \$2,971,689 as of July 1, 2011.
