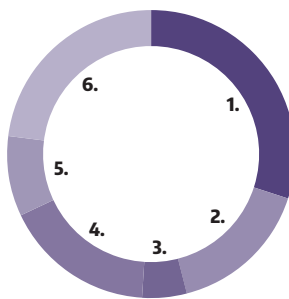
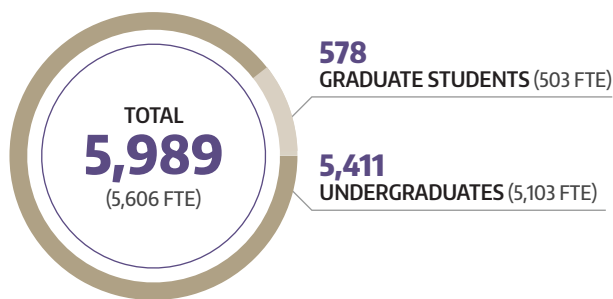

ACCESS AND OPPORTUNITY



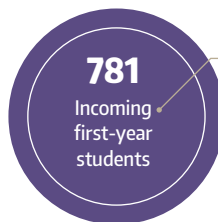
In fall 2018, **50 percent** of incoming first-year students and **39 percent** of incoming transfers would be first in their immediate families to earn a four-year degree.



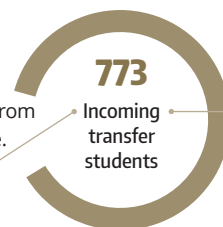
40 percent of incoming first-year students and **33 percent** of incoming transfers are eligible for federal Pell grants.



More than 300 students at UW Bothell are eligible for veterans benefits.

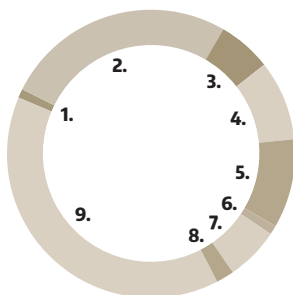


99% of incoming first-year students and 99% of incoming transfers in fall 2018 come from Washington state.



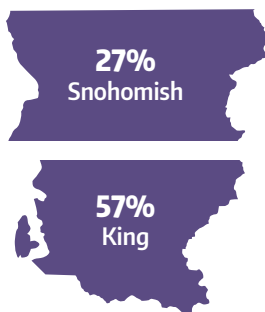
Of the incoming transfers, 86% come from a Washington state community college.

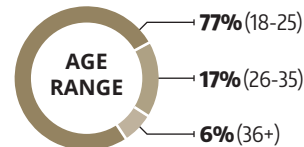

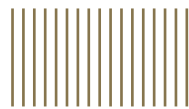

AVERAGE CREDIT LOAD (per quarter)

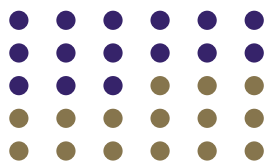

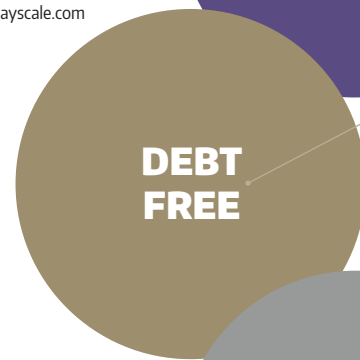
ALUMNI SUCCESS

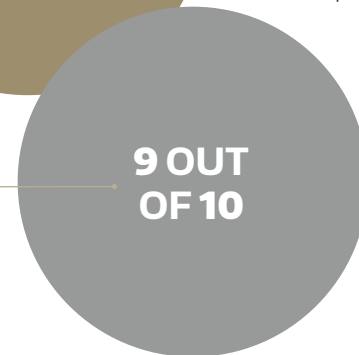
BEST RETURN ON INVESTMENT

SUSTAINABILITY



The shared UW Bothell/Cascadia College campus was one of the first in the nation to be Salmon-Safe certified in 2008 — and was recently recertified in 2018.



For the second year in a row, UW Bothell has been included on the Princeton Review's Green Honor Roll.



As part of Puget Sound Energy's Green Direct Program, UW Bothell will be eligible in 2021 to purchase 100 percent of its energy from dedicated, local, renewable energy resources for the following 15 years.
