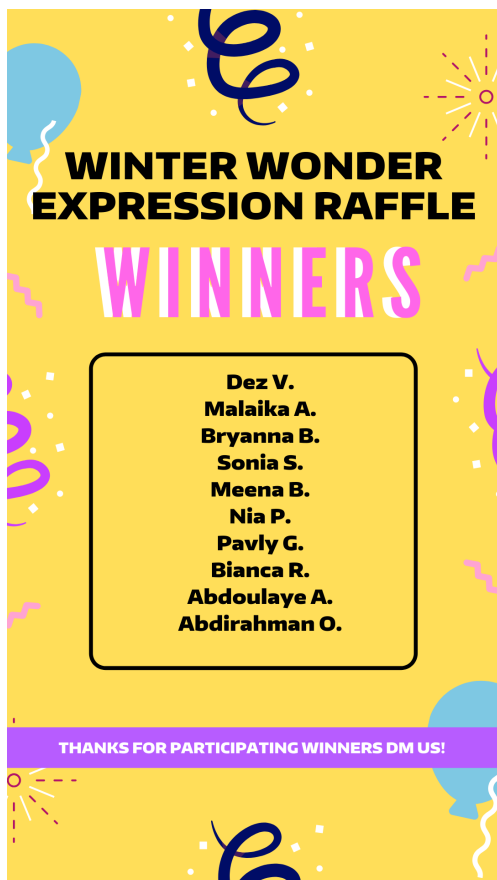

2020 YOUNG PACIFIC LEADERS CONFERENCE

The seventh Young Pacific Leaders Conference in Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea, will enhance Pacific leaders', ages 25-35, leadership skills and regional knowledge to advance the economic vibrancy and civic engagement within the region. The YPL Conference will include informational sessions, skills workshops, cultural activities, and site visits to deepen participants' capacity to address regional issues related to YPL's four programmatic themes: Education; Environment and Resource Management; Civic Leadership; and Economic and Social Development. Applicants will be selected from across the independent Pacific states, Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Pacific French Territories, and the American-affiliated Pacific (American Samoa, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and Hawaii). Outstanding alumni of previous conferences are also invited to apply to participate in the 2020 YPL Conference as alumni mentors.

WASHINGTON STATE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Baccalaureate Scholarship provides up to \$22,500 in financial aid support and access to career-launching support services for students pursuing high-demand STEM and health care majors. 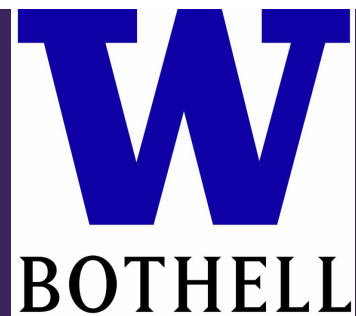
