SELF-SERVICE INSTRUCTIONS

When your MiniMax containers are full, empty them into centralized recycle, landfill (garbage) and compost bins.

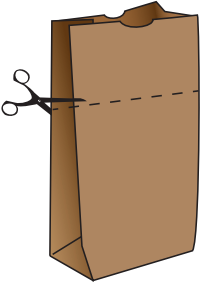


WHY MINIMAX?

Our campus standard is that food and compostable packaging (including food-contaminated cardboard, paper napkins, and paper towels) must be placed in compost containers. Recyclable materials should also be kept out of the landfill and must be recycled. Very little (~5%) of what is thrown away on our campus belongs in the garbage.

Taking personal responsibility for waste generation also provides custodians with more time to clean for health. As a reminder, the custodians will no longer be emptying your bins (that you used to set outside your office) on Tuesday and Thursday nights. Instead, they will be servicing the centralized bins.

HOW TO MAINTAIN YOUR MINIMAX BINS



A brown sandwich bag can be trimmed and used as a liner within the small, gray bin.



To clean bins, use a disinfectant wipe or rinse with soap and water.



Empty your bins before the weekend or any scheduled time off.
