Applications are accepted only once per year for Autumn Quarter.

Application Deadline: Early April. Please check program website for more details.

- *You will hear if you have been admitted to IMD in late May or early June via uw email.*

Number of prerequisites that can be in progress at the time of application:

- To be more competitive, complete all prerequisites by end of winter quarter.
- With one or two prerequisites courses in progress during Spring then, applications are taken under consideration for review.

Additional Coursework: Pre-Major students can take the following coursework that can count towards graduation requirements for the IMD program.

- Diversity Requirement
- Courses needed to complete VLPA/I&S/NW requirements. CSS/Interdisciplinary Arts (BIS, BISIA, BISMCS) courses can be great options.

 - The IMD admissions committee will be looking for candidates who clearly articulate their interest in and capacity to learn to work with digital tools, to engage with art and design thinking, to think critically about interactive media, and to work collaboratively with others in a diverse cohort. If you have any poor grades or gaps in your educational progress, you are encouraged to include a short explanation.
- **Design Portfolio (required):** IMD does not accept original artwork, thumb drives or DVDs. Please include a web-site address on the application. To learn more, visit the [IMD design portfolio web page](#).
 - The IMD admissions committee will review individual samples of creative and/or interactive media work and experience. A portfolio of work samples is useful since it gives the committee a sense of the range of an applicant's interests, skills, and capacities. Work samples may include graphic art/design, digital/media art, website development, video/film, games, apps, etc. They may come from previous coursework relevant to the IMD degree, including prerequisite courses, and/or from other non-academic (work or volunteer or artistic) contexts.
