The first is funding for a 2020 census kick off event in March or April 2020. This will

be a collaboration between multiple on campus groups including: the Diversity Center, Social Justice Organizers, ACT, ASUWB, and Residential Life. Our goal is to raise awareness of the importance of the census, educate students about its impact on daily lives, as well as encourage students to get civically engaged. Our event will be a kick off event for the 2020 census where students are invited to a one day event with flash talks (like TedTalks) from three different local speakers, booths with student organizations who are programming for the census, booths with census form assistance, as well as a photo booth where students can take pictures with our 2020 census background that says "I Count" to promote through social media. There will also be 2020 census promotional items available to students such as buttons, stickers, and bookmarks. Dinner will be provided in order to keep students engaged and energized over the four-hour event. The types of speakers and talks we are looking for were inspired by UW Seattle's Racial Categories and the 2020 Census Conference. Examples of talks are: "American Indian/Alaska Native Identity and Issues with US Census" Patricia Whitefoot, "King County 2020 Census Efforts, highlighting why AAPIs are historically undercounted population" Heidi Park, and "Considering Disaggregation of the Census' Black Racial Category: Context and Implications" Brukab Sisay. The second is funding for 21 Progress (a community organization) to come in to provide a civic leadership series training for students. 21 Progress's mission is to build a 21st Century Movement for Equity & Justice. Through popular education, civic engagement and arts & culture, 21 Progress assists emerging leaders – especially young adults and immigrants – to claim their place in building a more just society and reaching their dream. 21 Progress has multiple types of workshops they could lead students through including: a purpose dinner, a civic skills training called "Building Community and Trust", as well as a civic skills training about how to do outreach. We would be paying 21 progress for their time, training, and curriculum. Through these trainings they would provide students with coalition building and civic engagement skills that are applicable for the 2020 census, 2020 elections and beyond. We want to mention that UW Bothell did partner with 21 Progress to apply for a grant that we will hear back from on November 18th. If we receive the grant it will fund students to go through the trainings and do outreach in the community. With more funding through SAF we would be able to fund more students on campus to go through these trainings. If we did not get the grant, SAF would be our only way to provide this civic leadership training opportunity for students.

UW Bothell students lack awareness around the 2020 census. The census only happens every 10 years, this year being unique. There is a lot of fear and confusion about the 2020 census having the citizenship question on the form, which it will ultimately NOT be on the form. Our

goals are to build trust around the 2020 census and educate students on the significance of the census in relation to the distribution of \$300 billion federal funding between 2020–2030, and the potential for reapportioning Washington State House of Representative seats based on 2020 Census data. We would do this through working with multiple on campus clubs and organizations.

According to census data undercounted populations include: the homeless, immigrant, refugee, LGBTQIA, and renters of which our UW Bothell students represent. Our hope is students will go through the trainings and/or kickoff then bring that information back to their communities and families.

This programming is essential for students because many students utilize public transportation, receive federal aid for tuition and live in campus housing. We are seeking funding because these requests are not a part of ACT or ASUWB's annual budget.

We estimate this program benefiting about 200 students or more on campus. Through marketing we will get to spread awareness about the census and once students learn about it we hope they bring the information to their communities. Benefits for students include: knowledge and education about what the census is, why it is important, increased autonomy and confidence around taking action in their community, and increased civic leadership. Having this knowledge and awareness around the census benefits our students and their communities long term, including for the 2030 census. It is a great way for students to get civically engaged because unlike voter registration every person counts and does not need to be a citizen to fill out the census. Many students with varying immigration status may not be aware their families and themselves are protected if they fill out the census due to privacy and protection laws. It is essential we lead an event encouraging people to have a voice regardless of origin. Staff and faculty would also gain from this event, spreading awareness in their communities.
