Jay uses a multimedia approach that takes students through an A-to-Z menu of foods that educates and entertains as he describes what each item tells about love, sex, dating, and relationships. The goal of this program would be to promote sexual health and communication on campus through an accessible and inclusive environment that values diverse voices and experiences. Jay would be invited to visit campus for one evening lecture. In exchange for Jay's contribution we would like to provide him with an appropriate compensation. Due to Jay being a Seattle local, he will not be charging us for any transportation or travel expenses.

In an effort to support that claim, we must actively seek out people and resources to help enrich our diverse educational experiences. Guest speakers provide innovative and outside perspectives and an opportunity for students, as well as faculty and staff, to engage in a community discourse beyond campus boundaries. In our role as HEROs, we have found through engaging with students that sex is a difficult and often uncomfortable topic to talk about. According to the NCHA data, 68.5% of college students have had at least 1 or more sexual partners in the last year and 31.5% have not. Out of 92,366 students, 23.3% (21,539) of those students had not been informed about sexual assault/relationship violence prevention. This demonstrate the need for inclusive, judgement free spaces for students to learn about sexual health and consent. Jay Friedman speaks to the benefits of sexual health and communication, across a diverse spectrum of embodied identities/experiences; providing a comfortable atmosphere to talk about sex.

By hosting a guest speaker's public lecture in the third floor of the Activities and Recreation Center, we would be able to comfortably accommodate up to 300 attendees. Additionally, we will reach out to other student groups and organizations on the UW Bothell Campus; including (but not limited to) the Campus Events Board, and Gender Equity Club; as well as any other interested groups within the entire UWB community; in order to ensure that this service effectively benefits as many UWB community members as possible.</p>

While he uses photos, it is the responsibility of the host to provide food as a learning resource. Having food is integral to this program because it is the educational tool to follow along with. For example, Jay uses pictures of doughnuts to show how people can come in all shapes, sizes, flavors, etc. For students who are more visual learners, having different doughnuts physically available will help them achieve the learning outcomes and keep them engaged in the program. In addition, a recommendation from Jay was to have people shaped ginger bread cookies that will help to visually represent the students own body which makes it easier to visualize certain topics relating to your body and relationships. Food allows students to engage and follow along with the lecture and use their hands and eyes to learn instead of just their ears.
