The Campus Events Board is the student-run programming board at UWB. Students will benefit from the educational and social programs CEB plans because their events help to create a a sense of community and tradition at the University of Washington Bothell. The goal is to provide quality programs which represent the diverse interests of our students as well as providing them ways to become involved in campus life and their community.

The Campus Events Board is requesting more money to switch the members of the board from a stipend wage to an hourly wage. Currently the Campus Events Board is being paid a stipend for 10 hours per week for each programmer. Due to the high amount of programming taking place to meet student needs, programmers are working more than the stipend 10 hours per week. Campus Events Board has seen an influx in attendance, requests from departments, requests from student organizations, and requests for co-sponsorships, that allowing us to switch	

from a stipend to hourly pay would be beneficial for the board.

By switching all members to an hourly position, the board will prevail in the following ways:

- More time to plan each event to help improve event quality
- The ability to plan a more diverse range of events to mirror our diverse student population
- A better reach to the student body to increase a greater sense of community
- And the possibility to have more events each quarter

The request Campus Events Board is submitting is to cover additional hours and to transition from stipend to hours, per state regulations of how to pay students. Campus Events Board is also requesting more money for traveling expenses so that we can send two programmers and the advisor to the National Association of Campus Activities (NACA) national conference.

Question:

How do you plan to assess the program or service?

The Campus Events Board is constantly assessing the success and quality of their programs. One of their primary concerns is that they are serving all students. Campus Events Board seeks to plan at least one program per quarter for every demographic represented on campus, from new students to students with children.

Campus Events Board allows students to talk with the programming board during office hours and attend their open meeting to give feedback on events and ideas for future events.

Thus far in our programming year we have yet to have an event that has not had a substantial amount of attendance compared to the attendance of events in the previous years.

Currently The Campus Events Board has approximately 50 students attending each event. The Campus Events Board strives to reach all students on campus by planning a diverse range of events. By switching the
