For the past several years, the CCAP/Services and Activities Fee has been able to assist high-need student/parents with a portion of childcare costs.</p>

The need for childcare assistance has not diminished as a result. Without some form of childcare assistance, many student/parents are simply not able to attend school. While financial aid can help with childcare costs, the assistance comes in the form of loans. The CCAP lessens the loan burden by helping our student/parents with grant funding.</p> <p data-bbox="607 1108 1437 1318">For the 2010-2011 academic year, we able to award 10 students before our allocation was fully exhausted. The UWB campus as a whole benefits from the program because student/parents are able to attend classes, participate in class discussion, participate in campus activities, and contribute their ideas, suggestions, and opinions in all of these forums. A true diverse campus atmosphere must include the participation of the student/parent. Financial aid can provide assistance in the form of student loans only.</p>
<p>How do you plan to assess the program or service?</p>	<p>We require verification and documentation of childcare costs and receipts at the close of each quarter. By requesting these items at the end of each quarter our goal is to ensure accurateness, effectiveness, and integrity of the Child Care Assistance Program. Awards for subsequent quarters are not released until the verification of documents have been approved.</p>
<p>In 150 words or less, please describe the benefits that participants are likely to gain by attending or participating in this program or service.</p>	<p>Many parents cannot attend class, complete homework, and study unless they have some form of childcare. For some students, 40% in childcare assistance can mean the difference between attending UWB or not attending, or attending UWB full-time instead of part-time. The CCAP fund directly helps UWB students achieve their educational goals. When a student obtains their UWB degree they are positioning themselves to achieve gainful employment in order to support their families</p>

	and to demonstrate to their children that education is a worthwhile effort and investment.
