

SAF Annual Proposal Form for the 2013-2014 Academic Year

The SAF Committee will be accepting applications for the annual budgeting cycle from November 30, 2012 until 5:00pm on January 16th, 2013. The intent of the annual operating budget is to support on-going student activities, services, and programs. Services and Activities Fees are defined in RCW 28B.15.041 to mean "fees, other than tuition fees, charged to all students registering at the . . . state universities . . . The legislature also recognizes that Services and Activities Fees are paid by students for the express purpose of funding student activities and programs" of their particular institution. These funds will be available for the 2013 to 2014 academic year.

A member of your group must be available to attend a hearing with the SAF Committee tentatively scheduled for Friday, February 8, 2013 and Friday, February 15, 2013. Please include a regularly checked email in the application, as that will be the main form of communication between SAF and the requesting group. The SAF Liaison will contact the requesting group to notify them of a hearing time.

A major obstacle in pursuing higher education for student-parents is the need for childcare. For the past several years, the Services and Activities Fees has helped assist high-need student-parents with childcare costs through the Childcare Assistance Program (CCAP). The past handful of years, the UW Bothell has seen a substantial increase in the student population. As the student population grows so does the student-parent population and thus, the need for expanded student services such as the Child Care Assistance Program. The CCAP fund is helpful for students who may not continue with their higher education because of the lack of funding assistance for child care. While financial aid office can increase the cost of attendance to include child care costs the reality is that this increased budget is met with additional student loans. The CCAP fund can help lessen the loan debt burden that many students are facing today.

The assistance program will help with 40% of child care costs for pre-school aged dependents and 20% of child care costs for school aged dependents. For the current year, we are funding 13 students who are enrolled in 10+ credits. We've exhausted this year's allocation of \$32,900. We have a wait list of 8 students who we could not award based on the availability of funds. A total of 21 students applied for the program.

We require verification and receipts/documentation of the child care costs each quarter. By continually assessing awards to make sure they are disbursed and used appropriately throughout the academic year, we ensure the integrity, accurateness, and effectiveness of the program. The financial aid staff devotes time and effort in to verifying costs. The awards for subsequent quarters are not released until verification is approved.

The 21st Century Campus Initiative is supported by the Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP) in three areas: growth, student-centrality, and diversity.
