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**Executive Summary of Your Proposal, please provide a concise overview of the program, activity, or service for which you seek funding.**

Clamor, the UWB Literary and Arts Journal, is an annual publication that comes out each spring. It is created through an IAS course, BISKL 401, that enrolls students editors who earn two credits for winter and spring quarters to bring out the journal. Clamor is the only outlet for students to publish literary and artistic work at UWB. This is the third year that Clamor is operating under the name Clamor. It seeks to be competitive with the best college literary and arts journals.

For students publishing in the journal, this publication represents a significant and lasting achievement. For all students at UWB who read Clamor, the literary and arts journal provides a sense of creative community. Last year, our run of 750 copies quickly disappeared--well before spring quarter was over.

**How do you plan to assess the program or service?**

First and foremost, we will assess this program by the quality of the journal itself. In addition, we will assess this program by the number of printed copies of the volume that disappear from its public locations at UWB--and the audience participation at its launch. (Last year 750 copies of the journal disappeared before the end of spring quarter and some 60-70 people were in attendance at the spring journal party.) We will also assess the program through student evaluations of the course.

Five current student editors gain intensive training in journal editing, production, and distribution. Another 40 or so students gain a strong sense of achievement from publication in the journal. At least 750 UWB students gain from reading the journal and / or attending the journal launch--a live reading of everyone presented in the journal.
