University Courses Taught

Global Health

Farmworker Health [Online] (2 cr); Summer 2021.

Overview for RN-BSN students of key health issues impacting farmworkers in the US.

Global Health – Critical Perspectives [Online] (5 cr); Summer 2020.

Critical exploration into the emerging field of global health, focusing on how historical and social forces shape health in the world; and global health practice and strategy across different contexts.

Health Actions for Women: Local & Global Settings [F2F] (5 cr); Spring 2018.

Uses an innovative resource guide targeted at women, girls, and their allies working to educate, advocate, and mobilize their communities for women's health and rights. Course examines these through reviews of recent community-based research, and learn through hands-on engagement experiences (e.g., educational theater).

Latinx Health & Culture: Issues, Beliefs, Practices, and Local Perspectives [F2F/Online/Hybrid] (5 cr); Spring 2017, Winter 2018, Fall 2020; Winter 2022.

Examines health issues in the Latina/o community through the lens of health research, arts and other cultural expressions, community organization stakeholders, and fieldwork. Focuses on the diverse experiences with health care and healing systems of this rapidly growing US community.

Migration and Population Health: Global Representation in Films and Arts [Online] (5 cr); Winter 2021.

Provides a link between migration and public health using the social determinants of health framework. Emphasizes how migrants/immigrants are portrayed in films, television, literature, music, and other artistic images. Explores theories of migration, migration-health relationship, and health issues of migrant populations.

Health Systems

Health Policy and the Organization of Health Care [F2F] (5 cr); Fall 2017.

Overview of health policy and the organization of healthcare systems for RN-BSN students including structure, financing, and regulation. Introduces roles and approaches for healthcare professionals to participate in organizational, community, governmental health policy activities.

Public Health Practice

Health Studies Fieldwork [F2F/Hybrid] (2 cr); Winter 2014, Fall 2015, Spring 2016, Winter 2021, Spring 2021, Spring 2022.

This course arranges independent fieldwork or internship in a local/regional health-serving organization relevant to the student's focus on health. The focus is on facilitating career development and connecting classroom and practice. Individual practicum experiences are negotiated and supervised by faculty.

Health Studies Senior Portfolio [Hybrid] (3 cr); Spring 2018.

Focuses on developing a learning and professional portfolio, advancing critical thinking skills, synthesis of knowledge relevant to the health field, and honing writing and presentation capacities for appropriate audiences. Involves collaboration with other graduating students.

Latinx Leadership Initiative [Online] (2-3 cr); Winter 2021, Spring 2021, Winter 2022, Spring 2022.

In collaboration with the Latino Educational & Training Institute, engage Latinx students in identity exploration, practice multicultural leadership skills and complete a 40-hour group community service project to benefit the Latinx community.

MN Pathway Planning, Practicum, and Portfolio [F2F] (1-6 cr); 2016, 2017, F/W/Spr 2018.

Critically examines advanced nursing roles in complex and inter-professional healthcare environments, including clinical practice, leadership, and education. Coaches students to analyze their current fit with the competencies required for advanced roles. Creates plans for elective coursework and practicum experiences to meet competencies of selected advanced nursing role.

Pathways to Health Studies [F2F/Hybrid] (2 cr); 2015, Spring 2018, Spring 2020.

Provides a forum for students to plan their educational pathway within the Health Studies major. Provides an overview of career options and professional development opportunities, supplemented with guest lectures by professionals working in the field.

Public Health Nutrition Practicum [F2F] (2 cr); Fall 2005

This practicum course in Public Health Nutrition prepared 1st year graduate students at UC Berkeley for advanced public health nutrition roles in community, population-based care, management in health care systems.

Public Health Theory & Frameworks

Introduction to Public Health [F2F/Online] (5 cr); Fall 2014, Winter 2016, Fall 2020.

Provides an introduction to the principle of public health with exploration of the frameworks, tools, and evidence base that guides disease prevention and health promotion efforts.

Consideration is given to ethical and public policy issues important to ensuring health equity.

Program Planning & Strategies for Health Promotion [F2F/Online/Hybrid] (5 cr); Winter 2018, Winter 2020, Summer 2020, Winter 2021; Summer 2021; Winter 2022.

Introduction to program planning for students in Health Education & Promotion minor, including: needs and capacity assessment, strategy selection, and theoretical frameworks. Covers program implementation, management, and evaluation concepts. Assignments include developing a sample program plan and experiential, community-based activities.

Research Methods & Program Evaluation

Community Engagement in Public Health Interventions & Research [F2F] (5 cr); Fall 2014, Spring 2015.

This course introduces the principles and approaches to engaging and collaborating with communities when planning, implementing, and evaluating population-level health interventions and research. Considers principles, methods, and analysis of community engagement & CBPR.
