Bachelor of Arts in Health Studies

Exploring the social and biological determinants of health, students engage in inquiry and research to improve health outcomes for individuals and communities.

Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program

The RN-to-BSN program is a one-year hybrid program that focuses on nursing research, leadership and community health.

Master of Nursing

This program — ranked #1 in the nation — is designed to prepare nurses for advanced leadership roles in health care practice, education, administration, community, policy and research settings. Students create their own focus of study by selecting elective courses from across the UW's tri-campus system that support their academic and career goals.

Master of Science in Community Health & Social Justice

Graduates are equipped to dismantle racism, promote social justice, build capacity for health equity and develop culturally relevant health programming. The program also prepares students for certifications in Public Health (CPH) or as a Health Education Specialist (MCHES / CHES).

SOCIAL JUSTICE FOCUS

UW Bothell's School of Nursing & Health Studies is committed to advancing social justice in health and nursing through innovative curricula, research and community engagement. Students patrticipate in fieldwork experiences with community partners serving diverse organizations and individuals.

THE UW BOTHELL DIFFERENCE

Diverse student body

 UW Bothell is designated as a Minority Serving Institution, with almost two-thirds of students identifying as people of color.

Access and opportunity

- UW Bothell is designated as a **First-Gen Forward** institution.
- About one-third of incoming firstyear students and almost half of new incoming transfers will be the first in their immediate families to pursue a four-year degree.
- 32% of incoming first-year students and 38% of incoming transfer students are eligible for federal Pell grants, based on family income.
- In 2023-24, 72% of all undergraduate students and 69% of all graduate students graduated debt-free.

Smart investment

- UW Bothell ranks No. 1 in Washington state for students' return on investment. (PayScale 2024)
- UW Bothell ranks No. 2 in the state for colleges that provide the best value for students. (Smart Asset 2023)

Driving regional impact

- Almost 92% of UW Bothell students come from Washington state.
- 87% of UW Bothell's more than 32,000 alumni live and work in Washington state.
