EDUCATING INSPIRED SCHOLARS

HANDS-ON LEARNING

All Interdisciplinary Arts & Sciences programs are grounded in the belief that hands-on learning and practice should be a central element of education. Small classes, accessible faculty and innovative teaching help students gain practical skills related to their individual goals and interests.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Students get high-impact learning opportunities outside of the classroom — through internships, study abroad, research projects and participation in cohort-based field trips. Our annual Washington, D.C., Human Rights Seminar was one of the first undergraduate human rights research seminars in the world.

CAREER-BUILDING DEGREES

In addition to our bachelor of arts and master of fine arts degrees, we also offer three bachelor of science degrees. Students pursuing a B.S. degree in Earth System Science, for example, benefit from teaching and research collaborations within the School of STEM.

STUDENT MEDIA

Students can join multiple on-campus clubs — including Clamor, a professional-grade arts journal; the Husky Herald, UW Bothell's campus newspaper; and UWave Radio, a student-run radio station.

THE UW BOTHELL DIFFERENCE

Diverse student body

 UW Bothell is designated as a Minority Serving Institution, with almost two-thirds of students identifying as people of color.

Access and opportunity

- UW Bothell is designated as a **First-Gen Forward** institution.
- About one-third of incoming firstyear students and almost half of new incoming transfers will be the first in their immediate families to pursue a four-year degree.
- 32% of incoming first-year students and 38% of incoming transfer students are eligible for federal Pell grants, based on family income.
- In 2023-24, 72% of all undergraduate students and 69% of all graduate students graduated debt-free.

Smart investment

- UW Bothell ranks No. 1 in Washington state for students' return on investment. (PayScale 2024)
- UW Bothell ranks No. 2 in the state for colleges that provide the best value for students. (Smart Asset 2023)

Driving regional impact

- Almost 92% of UW Bothell students come from Washington state.
- 87% of UW Bothell's more than 32,000 alumni live and work in Washington state.
