Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

- Enacted in 1974
- Applies to all educational institutions that receive federal funding
- Rights of the university record belong to the student
- Rights begin when in attendance
 - Parents lose right when student turns 18 (or when student enrolls)

Upon Application - Educational Record is created

Any information directly related to a student that is maintained by an educational institution:

- High School Attended
- Test Scores Earned
- Quarterly Class Schedule at UW Bothell
- Grades
- Quarterly Tuition charged
- Financial Aid awarded
- Etc...



What does it mean for staff and faculty? For you?

- All students attending an institution of higher education receiving federal Title IV funds, regardless of age, are protected under FERPA.
- Parents lose rights when student is in attendance.
- University staff, faculty and administrators are the stewards of information and the gatekeepers in the protection of student privacy.
- Confidentiality must be applied to all records.
- We can speak only in generalities.

Exceptions

Health & Safety Emergencies

- "Articulable and significant threat to the health and safety of the student or other individuals"
- May release to local law enforcement, parents or outside entities if release is related to safety

Other Exceptions

- With students' written permission for case-by-case basis
- If student is under 21 and violates law or school policy related to alcohol or a controlled substance



With prior consent, you can ALSO have access to the following:

Financial Aid

• Students must complete a release form allowing access to records and information. The form is available online.

Tuition Bills

 Student can give you special limited access to MyUW to pay tuition.
