A. Executive Summary

The **Campus Design Review Team (CDRT)** reports to UW Bothell Chancellor Kristin G. Esterberg and Cascadia College President Eric W. Murray with recommendation and concurrence reports provided through Gowri Shankar, UW Bothell's Vice-Chancellor of Planning & Administration, and Meagan Walker, Cascadia College's Vice President of External Relations & Planning. During the 2022 academic year, the CDRT completed for Cascadia College the campus master plan design principals review for two projects: a recommendation for the Pandemic Memorial sculpture; and a concurrence with CC5 academic facility pre-design and siting. For UW Bothell the CDRT provided a recommendation on modifications to the Discovery Hall cell array equipment for T-Mobile (originally approved for Verizon by the Chancellor and President in December 2018).

In its fifth year as evolved from the Institutional Project Review Process of the Campus Master Plan, the Campus Design Review Team also led a campus exterior art inventory task force to inform pending and future exterior artwork installations. The task force included a few members from the CDRT as well as additional faculty and staff from both institutions. The task force's findings and exterior artwork inventory have been included within this report. Before the construction completion of the STEM4 facility, considerations for three cast bronze 'Rare Books' will be recommended for relocation within the Cascadia College exterior quadrangle.

This Annual Report has been prepared to summarize what campus-impacting projects were reviewed within the period, where these endeavors originated from, and the current statuses of the efforts.

Dear Colleagues,

Thank you for serving on the Cascadia College | University of Washington Bothell Campus Design Review Team (CDRT). CDRT reports to and advises the Chancellor of UW Bothell and the President of Cascadia College regarding project plans that have a temporary or permanent visual and/or functional impact on the campus and surrounding community setting, including historic resources.

The primary purpose of CDRT is to maximize the functionality and desirable experiential qualities of the campus and its facilities; and to encourage creativity, celebrate artistic expression, and enhance the visual landscape and context. Your service is important as we look to strategically align new opportunities with the Campus Master Plan and help plan a cohesive campus into the future.

D. Campus Exterior Art Taskforce

The Task Force¹ for Exterior Campus Art met two times (March and May 2022) to develop a [Work Plan](#)² and prepare an inventory of artworks and exterior monuments. Their secondary task was to recommend locations for displaced art. Cascadia College is currently working with Bothell Arts Commission to catalog and map public art. The Washington State Arts Commission inventory³ for exterior works needs to be updated for locations. The Taskforce recommendations include:

- Complete catalog of exterior work by consulting faculty with students;
- Re-install bronze books within Cascadia College quadrangle;
- Update Inventory List with WSAC and institutions to identify art to maintain; and
- Generate online integrated campus map; perhaps student project or with City of Bothell.

E. The CDRT and C-ART are Looking Forward to 2022-2023!

The CDRT will be scheduled between in September 2022 following a new charge letter. It is anticipated that the forthcoming academic year may engage the CDRT to concur or review (a) the Cascadia College Phase 5 design (if approved for funding); (b) expanding the pandemic memorial with trees, landscaping, and additional sculptural 'Talking Panel'; (c) Dragonfly sculpture location and Conex décor; (d) 'Rare Books' within the CC Quadrangle; (e) STEM4 Exterior Campus Art Site Location; and (f) possible pocket parks. The replaced Ancestors sculptures (count & configuration) may not need CDRT consideration under the discretion of the Chancellor of the University of Washington Bothell and the President of Cascadia College. The Exterior Campus Artwork Inventory task force efforts may want to be coordinated with the WSAC and the Bothell Arts Commission.
