Minimum declaration requirements:

- UW Cumulative GPA: 2.5 minimum UW GPA with at least 2 quarters completed at UW Bothell
- World Language: 2 years (or more) in high school or 10 college credits of a single language
- Intermediate Algebra in high school or (min. grade 2.0 if completed through college coursework) or high level math
- Effective for applicants entering Autumn 2022 and later: BIS 215 Understanding Statistics or equivalent (min. grade 2.0) will be required to apply
- 10 credits of English Composition (min. grade 2.5 in each course), Research Writing recommended
- BIS 170 (min. grade 2.0)
- 5 credits Quantitative & Symbolic Reasoning (QSR) BIS 215 counts as QSR
- 10 credits Visual, Literary and Performing Arts (VLPA)
- 10 credits Individuals & Societies (I&S) BIS 170 counts as I&S
- 10 credits Natural World (NW)

Personal Statement:

Students who do not meet the minimum declaration requirements may apply to IAS majors by submitting a Personal Statement (1-2 pages) with their application. Ideally, a personal statement should address:

- The reason(s) why you wish to pursue the major to which you are applying
- Your long term goals and aspirations
- Any special circumstances you would like the Committee to consider

Number of prerequisites that can be in progress at the time of application:

- Classes can be in progress, but application must include a personal statement
- If the following classes are <u>in progress</u> when you apply, then you <u>will not receive a decision</u> <u>until grades post</u>: BWRIT 134, BWRIT 135, World Language, QSR/BIS 215, BIS 170
- If the other prerequisite courses (not mentioned above) are in progress, then you may receive a decision prior to grades posting

Other Important Information for Applicants:

- S/NS Grades during COVID-19- For any quarter designated as having extenuating circumstances, IAS will consider a S (satisfactory) grade as fulfilling admission requirements, meaning a S grade will not negatively impact your application to the School of IAS.
- Personal statements matter. Students should address poor grades and major choice
- Do well in coursework related to the major and relevant work
- Students must take BIS 300 in their first quarter in IAS and also must complete a major orientation (Canvas link provided in admissions acceptance letter)
