- Complete all prerequisites by end of winter quarter to be more competitive.
- Applications are taken under consideration with one or two prerequisites courses in progress during Spring,

Important Program Information:

 IMD is a cohort model where admitted students take core classes as a group. Admitted students are required to purchase an Apple MacBook Pro. Details are posted on the <u>IMD</u> website.

Am I competitive? (Subject to change pending applicant pool):

- Admission is competitive because major is capacity constrained.
- Recommended grade of 3.0 or higher in each prerequisite in order to be competitive.
- Repeats ok? Yes, with an explanation. The higher grade is used for admission.
- **S/NS Grades during COVID-19** For any quarter designated as having extenuating circumstances, IMD will consider a S (satisfactory) grade as fulfilling admission requirements, meaning a S grade will not negatively impact your application to the IMD program.

 - o The IMD admissions committee will be looking for candidates who clearly articulate their interest in and capacity to learn to work with digital tools, to engage with art and design thinking, to think critically about interactive media, and to work collaboratively with others in a diverse cohort. If you have any poor grades or gaps in your educational progress, you are encouraged to include a short explanation.
- **Design Portfolio (required):** IMD does not accept original artwork, thumb drives or DVDs. Please include a web-site address on the application. To learn more, visit the <u>IMD design portfolio</u> web page.
 - The IMD admissions committee will review individual samples of creative and/or interactive media work and experience. A portfolio of work samples is useful since it gives the committee a sense of the range of an applicant's interests, skills, and capacities. Work samples may include graphic art/design, digital/media art, website development, video/film, games, apps, etc. They may come from previous coursework relevant to the IMD degree, including prerequisite courses, and/or from other non-academic (work or volunteer or artistic) contexts. If you submit work produced collaboratively, please describe your specific contribution.

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
