Call for Poster Proposals

Deadline: Friday, March 7, 2014

The Symposium provides an opportunity for the teaching and learning community to share best practices, celebrate accomplishments, and discuss the scholarship of teaching and learning in a forum dedicated to enriching the UW Bothell experience for faculty, staff, and students. We will focus on sharing ideas, practices, and initiatives that aim to transform students through their educational experiences and that acknowledge an increasingly connected world.

We seek proposals from faculty and staff, and from students working with a faculty or staff member, for engaging sessions that build on research and personal experience, help colleagues make improvements, highlight current and future campus and personal initiatives, and focus on ways we can put good ideas into action within and outside the classroom. Although we invite proposals on any teaching and learning topic, we encourage proposals reflecting, but not limited to, the Symposium's themes:

- Interdisciplinarity
- Integrated Learning
- Assessment Practices
- University/Community Experiential Learning
- Global Learning
- Technologies of Teaching and Learning



Submitting a Poster Proposal

The deadline for proposal submission is **Friday, March 7, 2014**.

Submit your proposal on line at: www.uwb.edu/tlc/events/proposal-submission

Hard copies of proposals will not be accepted. UW Bothell faculty members and librarians will review all proposals and make selections by March 21. Your proposal should be clear, concise, consist of a poster title and a description (no more than 250 words). Include presenter names, titles, institutional/organizational affiliations, e-mail, and phone numbers. Your title should accurately reflect the content and theme you have selected.

Format of the Day

The *Symposium* will include two poster sessions running 60 minutes each with a 15-minute break in between (one hour at poster, one hour to make rounds). Poster sessions combine visual displays of key information with written materials and small group interaction to create a more individualized learning experience. These sessions include 40"x 60" boards to display text, diagrams, pictures, and/or graphs that

depict program components, findings, samples of student work, and/or participant testimony. Poster proposals should describe the visual text, data, display, etc. and indicate how the data or information will be useful to a particular or multiple sectors of higher education.



Format for each poster session: 60 minutes; 1-2 facilitators; 40" x 60" poster boards (available for purchase at the UW Bothell Book Store). Poster board will be available at the bookstore after March 28. We will supply easels and binder clips. If you have other supply needs, please email tlc@uwb.edu or staff by April 4th.
