## Admissions Information

This program is a declarable major. If you meet the minimum requirements listed below, you may submit a major declaration form through the UWB website.

Minimum requirements for current UW Bothell students:

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 (All College Coursework)
- Cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all prerequire requirements, and a minimum of 2.0 in each course
- Minimum 3 prerequisites completed with 2 in progress to declare

## Curriculum Information

### General Education

To be eligible for graduation from the University, with the baccalaureate degree, a student must complete a minimum of 180 academic credits and satisfy all other specific requirements. The University of Washington Bothell has established minimum general education requirements for baccalaureate degrees. These minimum requirements are:

English Composition – 5 credits (A minimum grade of 2.0 is required)

Additional Writing – 10 credits

Reasoning (RSN) – 5 credits

Natural Sciences (NSc) – 15 credits

Arts and Humanities (A&H) – 15 credits

Social Sciences (SSc) – 15 credits

Diversity – 5 credits (can overlap with General Education requirements above)

### Major Requirements

For the Economics major, students must complete the following courses with the following grades (where indicated):

Prerequisites (25 Credits)

- BIS 215 (previously BIS 315), or B BUS 215, or BMATH 215, or STMATH 341 – Statistics
- STMATH 114, 124, 125, or 126, or B MATH 144 – Calculus 1
- B BUS 220/BIS 200 – Principles of Microeconomics
- B BUS 221/BIS 201 – Principles of Macroeconomics (*BBUS 220, or BIS 200, or B CUSP 200*)
- B WRIT 135 – Advanced Composition (B WRIT 134)

### Core Courses (20 Credits)

- B BUS 210 – Financial Accounting
- B BECN 302 – Intermediate Microeconomics (*BBUS 220, or BIS 200 and STMATH 114, or 124, or 125, or 126, or B MATH 144*)
- B BECN 303 – Intermediate Macroeconomics (*B BECN 302*)
- B BECN 382 – Introduction to Econometrics (*B BECN 302*)

### Economics Electives (20 Credits, choose 4 out of 5 courses)

- B BECN 300 – Quantitative Methods in Economics (*STMATH 114, or 124, or 125, or 126, or B MATH 144*)
- B BUS 301 – Data Management (*BIS 215, or BBUS 215, or B MATH 215, or STMATH 341*)
- B BECN/B BUS 458 – Risk Modeling (*B BECN 302*) O
- B BECN 460 – Financial Economics (*BECN 302 and either B BECN 458, or STMATH 330 and STMATH 392*)
- B BECN 469 – Game Theory (*BBUS 310 or STMATH 114, or 124, or 125, or 126, or B MATH 144*)
